Mr. Wilson stated the insurance company has elected to replace several damaged LED ceiling mounted lights in the highway garage and asked the board to be declare the old lights surplus and permit the lights to be sold to the public. Motion by Councilman Parsons to declare 25 damaged garage lights, surplus and allow for public purchase, with the signing of a Hold Harmless agreement with the Town, and a limit of 5 lights per person, price set at 10 dollars each, seconded by Councilman Stresing and carried. Superintendent Wilson presented the Quotation dated 11.07.2019 for 10 Wheeled International Dump Truck model 2021 HX520 6x4(HX52F) for \$232,534.94. Mr. Wilson requested the board review the quote and authorize purchase. Motion by Councilman Bliss to authorize the purchase of the truck without the air ride passenger seat configuration (if the deletion resulted in a price reduction), seconded by Councilman Parsons and motion carried.

- B. Planning Board & Zoning Board of Appeals and Code Office, Report from Mrs. Sandra Riker. Solar Law. Mrs. Riker reviewed the proposed Solar Law to update Town administrative fees. A Public Hearing will be held ahead of the December Board Meeting for a local law amendment the 2017 local law regarding Solar Energy Code.
- C. Parks/Special committee. Park Commissioner, Mr. Tom Stevens presented his report. Park improvements continue at a brisk pace. Mr. Stevens reported the concrete work has been complete on 2 pavilions. Excavation of the west parking lot will be done, weather permitting. The park is running smoothly except for a couple of water leaks in the lavatory resulting from an early freeze.
- D. Town Clerk, Mrs. Karen Maczynski, presented her report; Total Disbursements for the Month of August were \$7,808.50. Hunter licenses and building permits have been numerous.

Councilwoman Bolonda motioned to accept all reports and seconded by Councilman Parsons, and motion carried.

AUTHORIZATION FOR CANANDAIGUA NATIONAL BANK & TRUST TO ACT AS AGENT FOR THE TOWN OF BRISTOL TO ACCEPT 2020 TOWN AND COUNTY TAX BILLS

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Bristol approves Canandaigua National Bank to act as an agent for the Town of Bristol and collect Town and County Taxes for the year 2020 during the month of January; and

WHEREAS, The Canandaigua National Bank will accept tax bills from January 2nd through January 31st, full payments only (no installment payments) and will deposit these payments to the Town of Bristol Tax Collector Account on the following business day and notify the collector with an itemized listing of taxes received; and

WHEREAS, There will be no charge to the town for this service; and

WHEREAS, The Canandaigua National Bank, will not be responsible for any check that is returned for any reason; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That Canandaigua National Bank will be accepting tax bills for the Town of Bristol during the month of January 2020 with no expense to the Town; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That these monies will be deposited in the Town of Bristol Tax Collector's checking account #1103270230 with no expense to the Town and the bank will notify the town the following day with an itemized listing; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of this Board send a certified copy of this resolution to Canandaigua National Bank and retain a copy in the official Town records.
