If you have received a Traffic Ticket in the Town of Bristol, please note the following options:

Your plea must be returned to the court by the date listed on the left portion of your ticket.

Plead Not Guilty: By pleading NOT GUILTY, you exercise your right to a public trial at which the People of the State of New York, represented by the prosecution, must prove, beyond a reasonable doubt, that you have committed the offense alleged in the accusatory instrument. At the trial you will have the right to hear, see and challenge the evidence submitted to prove your guilt, including confronting, by cross-examination, the Police Officer, Peace Officer or other witnesses you testify against you. You have the right to have witnesses testify on your behalf and you may, but you are not required to, testify on your own behalf. The court will determine, after hearing all the evidence submitted at the trial, whether or not the People have proven guilt beyond a reasonable doubt, and will render an appropriate verdict.

Plead Guilty as Charged: By pleading GUILTY, you waive your right to a trial, and are subject to sentencing by the presiding judge any legally authorized sentence. You may withdraw your plea of guilty, at any time prior to sentencing and exercise your right to a trial.

Communication with the District Attorney's Office Concerning an Alternate Resolution: You may contact the Assistant District Attorney who is responsible for proving the charge or charges against you and negotiate an agreement to plead guilty to a legally authorized alternate offense, including a lesser included offense, through Email (9/8/2021 – ADA Meghan.Maslyn@ontariocountyny.gov). Any proposed agreement is subject to approval by the court. Upon a plea of guilty to the agreed-upon offense, you will be subject to sentencing by the presiding judge, to any sentence legally authorized to be imposed for the offense to which you plead guilty. If an agree upon resolution is reached, you will not need to appear personally in court.

Payment of Fines: Payment must be made by money order, credit or debit card, or cash. The Court will work out a payment plan with defendants if necessary.
