October 26th Community Meeting: Approximately 40 people attended the Community Meeting held at the Bristol Volunteer Fire Hall on State Route 64. Bob Green opened the meeting by greeting our visitors and introducing the Comprehensive Plan Committee. Justin Steinbach then took over and did a power point presentation for the group assembled. He provided them with some information regarding considerations for the Town and the need for a Comprehensive Plan and why it needs to be updated periodically. The group then broke into smaller groups and the committee members headed their discussion with regard to three questions:

- 1. What do you value most in the town?
- 2. What are the biggest issues facing Bristol today?
- 3. What would make Bristol better than it is today?

The results to those questions are attached at the end of this report. They will be useful for the group to address goals and actions in the updated Comp Plan.
