PUBLIC HEARING LOCAL LAW #3  
AMENDING COLD WAR VETERAN EXEMPTION  
REGULAR MEETING  
DECEMBER 11, 2017

PRESENT: Robert A. Green, Jr, Alden Favro, David Parsons, Thomas Stevens, Jeffrey Bliss, Ron Wilson, Sharon Miller, William Kenyon, Atty.

The Supervisor presented service plaques to retiring Councilmen Favro and Stevens thanking them for their years of service as Board members.

Representatives from Verizon Government Account Executive gave a presentation on installing GPS in our highway trucks. The cost would be approx. \$100.00 initial cost per vehicle and \$18.00 per month per vehicle for maintenance. The Board requested that they submit a proposal for 5 dump trucks, 2 light weight trucks and 2 mowers.

The Supervisor called the Public Hearing to order. No one present wished to comment on the proposed Local Law. The Supervisor closed the Public Hearing.

The Supervisor called the meeting to order at 720 PM. There was no one who wished privilege of the floor.

A motion was made by David Parsons, seconded by Al Favro, and carried to approve the minutes of the November 13, 2017 meeting.

A motion was made by Jeff Bliss, seconded by Tom Stevens, and carried to pay the following bills:

A motion was made by David Parsons, seconded by Jeff Bliss, and carried to accept the Supervisor's financial report for the month of November.

Sandy Riker, Secretary of the Planning and Zoning Boards, submitted their monthly report. The joint meeting of the Planning, ZBA and Town Board in regards to discussion on home occupations went well. The space allowed for use in an accessory building maybe rewritten. The ZBA will be meeting on December 12 for an area variance on Johnson Hill Drive.

Sandy Riker, Secretary for the Code Enforcement Officer, submitted the monthly report. Thirteen permits were issued. Twenty-eight inspections were performed. Eleven certificates of compliance were issued.

Ron Wilson, Hwy Supt. submitted his monthly report. The PESH inspection report has been received. Corrections will be made on their findings. They will be back for a follow up visit. The salt barn cover has been installed. Ron has ordered 500 tons of salt. The heater in the break room is not working. It was suggested that Ron look into a gas heater and place a timer on it.

Committee Reports- Tom Stevens reported on the Park Grant. Donation letter have been mailed out to town property owners. Within the first week approximately \$1 000 has been received.

The Town Clerk submitted her monthly report.

A motion was made by Jeff Bliss and seconded by Al Favro and carried to accept all departmental reports.

Discussion was held on a proposed Local Law on Keeping Animals Other Than Dogs was held. We have received copies from three towns already using such a law. The Town Attorney will review them and then present one for the Board's consideration.

A motion was made by David Parsons and seconded by Tom Stevens and carried to adopt the Violence Prevention Program Policy Statement that is attached to these minutes.

A motion was made by Jeff Bliss and seconded by David Parsons to adopt a resolution to create a Capital Reserve Fund pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 6-c. Roll call vote was taken. Councilman Favro-Yes, Councilman Stevens-Yes, Councilman Bliss-Yes, Councilman Parsons-Yes, and Supervisor Green-Yes. The motion was carried. A copy of the entire resolution is attached to these minutes.

Supervisor Green said the Electronic Waste Day program went very well. There were approx. 400 cars and trucks that participated. Two 48-foot trailers and a panel truck were filled.

A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by David Parsons and carried to petition NYS DOT to establish an area speed restriction on Vincent Hill Road.

A motion was made by Al Favro and seconded by Jeff Bliss and carried to accept the resignation of Councilman-elect Fred Stresing from the Board of Ethics.

A motion was made by Supervisor Green and seconded by David Parsons and carried to hold a Public Hearing on January 8, 2018 on a proposed Local Law to amend Local Law #3 of 2015 to incorporate the Solar Energy Code and any other or future Local Law, Ordinances to enable the Town Board to fix and revise fees and fines.

A motion was made by Supervisor Green and seconded by Al Favro to adopt Local Law #3 to provide certain benefits authorizing an Alternative Tax Exemption for Cold War Veterans. Roll Call vote was taken. Supervisor Green-Yes, Councilman Stevens-Yes, Councilman Favro, Councilman Favro-Yes and Councilman Bliss-Yes.

A motion was made by David Parsons and seconded by Jeff Bliss and carried to authorize the Supervisor to sign the 2018 Dog Control Contract with Ontario County.

A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by Jeff Bliss and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:40 PM.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF  
RESOLUTION SUBJECT TO  
PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM

- 1) PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on December \_\_, 2017 the Town Board of the Town of Bristol adopted a resolution subject to Permissive Referendum. The resolution authorized the establishment of a Capital Reserve Fund pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 6-c to pay costs to repair, refurbish, renovate and recondition existing buildings, tennis courts, basketball court, track, trail development and other improvements at park facilities owned and managed by the Town of Bristol.
- 2) This Resolution shall not take effect until 30 days after its adoption; nor until approval by the affirmative vote of a majority of electors of the Town of Bristol voting thereon, if within 30 days after the adoption of this Resolution, there be filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Bristol a petition signed and acknowledged in number equal to at least 5% of the total number of electors of the Town that voted in the last gubernatorial election, protesting against this Resolution and requesting that it be submitted to a vote of electors of the Town of Bristol.
