

TOWN OF BRISTOL
REGULAR MEETING
MARCH 12, 2018

PRESENT: Robert A. Green, Jr, David Parsons, Lauren Bolonda, Jeffrey Bliss, Fred Stressing, Ron Wilson, Sharon Miller, Russ Kenyon, Atty.

The Supervisor called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Privilege of the floor was given to Joe Green of 3998-Footer Road, concerning entrance to his property on Kent Road. It seems that he was unable to gain access to it because it was blocked with snow. The Highway Supt. will take care of the matter. Sam Finger, an Eagle Scout, presented a plan for trails in the Patriot Park which he would like to propose for an Eagle Scout project. Tom Stevens will oversee the project. The Town Board gave him their blessings to proceed with the project. Kelly Ducar, Assessor, spoke on the pending litigation between the Town and A-V Bristol LLC. A motion was made by Jeff Bliss and seconded by David Parsons and carried to adopt the attached resolution approving the settlement of pending tax assessment litigation with A-V Bristol, LLC.

A motion was made by David Parsons, and seconded by Jeff Bliss, and carried to approve the minutes of the February 12, 2018 meeting with a minor correction.

There was no Supervisor's monthly financial report for February at this time.

Sandy Riker, Secretary of the Planning and Zoning Boards, submitted their monthly report. There was no meeting for the Planning Board in March. The ZBA is working on definitions and mobile home regulations not located in mobile home parks. The Clean Energy Committee has presented for the Board's review, two proposed resolutions, one establishing energy benchmarking requirements for certain municipal buildings and the other a local law to establish a community choice aggregation (energy) program.

Sandy Riker, Secretary for the Code Enforcement Officer, submitted the monthly report. Four permits were issued. Thirty-four inspections were performed. He met with Jared Pantella from LaBella Engineers, to discuss a proposed large scale solar project at 4376 Rt 64. He attended the monthly CEO's meeting. He attended a six-hour training concerning on site wastewater.

Ron Wilson, Hwy Supt. submitted his monthly report. They have changed to 4 ten hours work days. He has order 800 tons of salt. The GPS with Verizon has been installed on the vehicles. They are placed medium rocks and back fil to stabilize the shoulders on Egypt Road.

Committee Reports- Tom Stevens submitted a written report. We are still waiting news on the Park grant. Tom Magnan, a Bristol resident and Eagle Scout is also deciding on a project for the Park. Donations are still coming in for improvements for the parks. Secondhand Sidekicks will be the band performing at Fun Day. The Bloomfield marching band has agreed to participate in the parade.

The Town Clerk submitted her monthly report.

A motion was made by Jeff Bliss and seconded by Lauren Bolonda and carried to accept all departmental reports.

The proposed local law for Control of Other Animals will be held over until next month.

Russ Kenyon will review the draft copy of the Fund Balance Policy and make any suggested changes for the Board's review.

A motion was made by Supervisor Green and seconded by David Parsons and carried to move \$50,000 to Highway Equipment Reserve.

Permission was given to Ron Wilson to check into some type of solar lighting for the transfer station.

A motion was made by Jeff Bliss and seconded by Fred Stresing and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:25 PM.
